This is Michael Akong reporting from the 2022 WMOF from the Vatican. Today we report on the alarming increases of violence in the family especially in the current pandemic, now going on three years.

We have a special guest with expertise in family violence, Dr. Christauria Welland-Akong. She has a doctorate in psychology with 25 years in the field of domestic violence, in addition to 50 years as a catechist. Dr. Welland, can you tell us how serious domestic violence is and if it also affects Catholic families?



DOMESTIC VIOLENCE IS A PANDEMIC!



Violence against women is a **global problem of pandemic proportions**, affecting one in three or 30% of women in their lifetime.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE IS A PANDEMIC!

Violence against women causes devastating harm to women's lives and that of their children.

SOMETIMES, IT LEADS TO DEATH

Osinachi Nwachukwu was a Nigerian gospel singer who was allegedly murdered by her husband in April 2022.

Their pastor had convinced her not to leave the marriage, and to forgive her husband and be reconciled on many occasions.





But Catholic families can't be affected by violence in the same way, right?



NOT IN CATHOLIC FAMILIES?

Studies show that there is no difference in the rate of domestic violence among Catholics than among people in the general population.

So yes, there is lots of violence in Catholic families too. And among Catholic teens and dating partners.





So, how many Catholic women specifically experience domestic violence?



STATISTICS ON CATHOLICS

There were over **500 million Catholic women** age 15 and above in 2020.

If we apply the global average of domestic violence of 30%, that comes to over 150 million Catholic women who have experienced physical or sexual violence at least once in their life.


If we lower that to 25%, to account for the lack of firm domestic violence data for Catholics, that is **still more than 125 million women!**



Has the coronavirus pandemic had any effect on violence against women?

THE CORONAVIRUS AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

The coronavirus has increased domestic violence worldwide. There are increases in emotional, family, financial, and employment stress, alcohol abuse as a coping strategy, and sales and use of firearms. Both incidents of violence and deaths have increased worldwide.

WHAT IS DOMESTIC VIOLENCE?

Domestic violence refers to behavior by an intimate partner or ex-partner, male or female, that causes harm and can include:

- **Physical aggression**
- **Sexual coercion**
- **Psychological abuse**
- Economic abuse, and

ALL ARE AT RISK!

Violence can happen to any woman, in any country – regardless of culture, religion or economic status.

In countries where women have less equality, there is a higher prevalence of violence against women.

IN THE CATHOLIC CATECHISM, WHAT IS THE DIVINE PLAN FOR MARRIAGE? IT IS MEANT TO BE A COMMUNION OF LIFE AND LOVE!

So, as pastoral agents how do we even begin to approach this vast problem?



WE'LL USE THE SEE, JUDGE, & ACT APPROAC

THE **FIRST STEP** is to **SEE** and learn:

What are the facts about domestic violence worldwide, including in Catholic families?





THE SECOND STEP is to ask and discern, or judge:

How can we learn more about domestic violence among Catholics, and apply Catholic Social Teaching?





THE THIRD STEP, part 1:

What can and should we do to respond **in the now** to the immediate needs of abused women, their children, and the men who abuse?





THE THIRD STEP, part 2
What can and should we do to address the root
causes of domestic violence?
Understanding these will lead to violence
prevention strategies.



So as pastoral agents, what indications might you notice that could be warning signs of violence in a family?



ONE WARNING SIGN

As Fr. Charles Dahm of the Archdiocese of Chicago teaches, if a woman asks to speak to a priest outside of confession, **it is very likely she is seeking counsel because she is experiencing domestic violence.**



SOME WARNING SIGNS

For all pastoral agents, notice if the woman is silent in the presence of her husband, shows fear of her partner, has bruises, or wears long sleeves in all weather. You may come upon her weeping alone in the church.

Notice if her husband is being openly controlling or abusive, if their children are failing at school, showing anxiety or depression, or are being aggressive themselves.



ONE OF MANY RISK FACTORS FOR DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

 In over 50% of cases, alcohol is involved in domestic violence incidents

EFFECTS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE ON ABUSED WOMEN

- Death, or
- Physical and sexual injuries
- Disability / chronic health conditions
- Miscarriage and abortion
- Depression
- Posttraumatic stress disorder
- Suicidal ideation/behavior
- Inability to parent effectively







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SOCIAL EFFECTS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Experiencing domestic violence also puts women and their children at greater risk of:

- Increased poverty
- Homelessness
- Sexual & labor exploitation/being trafficked
- Potentially fatal sexually transmitted infectons, e.g., HIV/AIDS

CHILDREN DO <u>NOT</u> NEED TO BE EXPOSED TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE!!
















CHILDREN SEE, CHILDREN DO

Since violence is a huge problem in our Catholic families, how are the teachings of the Magisterium guiding us towards a pastoral response?



ST. JOHN PAUL II'S TEACHING ON LOVE AND EQUALITY

- In his document Familiaris Consortio, he teaches:
- Love is the fundamental and innate vocation of every human being.
- In Mulieris Dignitatis, he teaches that men and women are equal before God.





POPE FRANCIS HAS STATED THAT CHRIST'S TEACHING ON WOMEN CHANGED HISTORY

- Christ's "doctrine on women" changed history," because up to that moment, the woman was "second class..."
- The woman before Jesus is one thing; the woman after Jesus is another.
- Jesus dignified woman and put her on the same level as man.
- Both are 'the image and likeness of God,' both;
- not men first and then women a bit lower.
- No, both."




JESUS SHOWED LOVE & RESPECT TO WOMEN

What if the assaulted person in his parable had been a woman?


AS JESUS SAID, GO AND DO LIKEWISE.

CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

- For 2000 years, the Church has reached out to the sick, the injured, and those who are oppressed, not fearing to stand up for the poorest and the most neglected.
- Those who suffer domestic violence are some of these people.
- Are we to ignore or minimize the needs of women who suffer because the violence is in their marriage and family?



Should we be concerned about those 125+ million Catholic women and their families? Is there a way to integrate the current state of knowledge about domestic violence with the teachings of the Church, and then come up with an action plan for pastoral agents?

• Get educated about domestic violence, including in the Magisterium!

- Listen to those involved and learn.
- Know your local resources.
- Respond & accompany with the love of Jesus.
- Teach & share your knowledge.
- Help to prevent violence in Catholic homes and schools.



FROM THE USCCB'S PASTORAL FRAMEWORK FROM 2021, WRITING ON RESPONSES TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE:

EDUCATE . . . The faithful on Church teaching about the dignity of each person made in the image of God.

ENCOURAGE... Those who use violence, as well as families and victims, to seek resources and support.

ENGAGE... by offering:

- Spiritual and material support for victims
- Trainings
- Lists of resources
